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What is ADHD?

Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) is one of the most common neurodevelopmental disorders. It is usually seen, but not always recognised, in childhood and often persists into adulthood. Approximately 7% of Australians are diagnosed with ADHD.

ADHD is known to impact many aspects of an individual's life. This can include academic and professional achievements, interpersonal relationships, and daily functioning. ADHD can also lead to poor selfesteem and social function issues in children and even adults when not appropriately treated. However, when diagnosed and well-managed, people can lead full lives, leveraging their unique differences to empower their success.

There is considerable symptomatic overlap between ADHD and other psychological and developmental conditions. Receiving any diagnosis is a big step, and you want to be sure you *receive the right diagnosis*.
